What we're learning in Sunday School this morning, January 11. Today's lesson studies "The Boy Jesus in the Temple." Jesus is always about His Father's business—and that business is always earning our salvation! No thing and no one can stand in His way. Consider discussing with your family "How does Jesus show that He is about His Father's business even at a young age and what is the most important part of His Father's business?"

Worship At Bethany

Does Bethany offer contemporary worship? Does Bethany have traditional services? Worship at Bethany is both - and neither. Like many parishes, Bethany seeks to unite God's family in worship that rises above stylistic preferences.

Christian worship begins with the crucified Christ, who comes to us in Word and Sacrament. He brings to the people of God forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. We in turn extol these gifts with joyful thanksgiving and praise, proclaiming the story of God's love through His Word. This celebration is done in concert with the Church throughout the world, and finds its expression in the liturgy. Lutheran worship is therefore traditional in that it is part of the timeless culture of the Church, and contemporary in that it communicates the Gospel in ways that are appropriate to a given place and time. Since worship is the vocation of all baptized Christians, Lutheran liturgy calls for all individuals to do their parts, that faith may be increased among all who worship, and that Christ may be most strongly confessed before the world.

Providing worship that achieves these noble ends is the responsibility of any Christian congregation. Continuing in the tradition of the evangelical Lutheran communion, the Divine Service at Bethany seeks therefore to involve all who gather in the name of the Lord in the proclaiming, confessing, singing, and praying of God's Word.

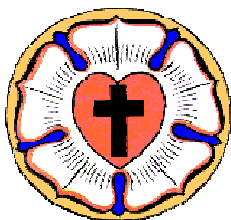
Bethany’s Non-Discrimination Policy

- ⌘ Remember that whatever your background, Bethany has help for you to grow in your knowledge of Christ. Wherever you are, that is where we want to start.

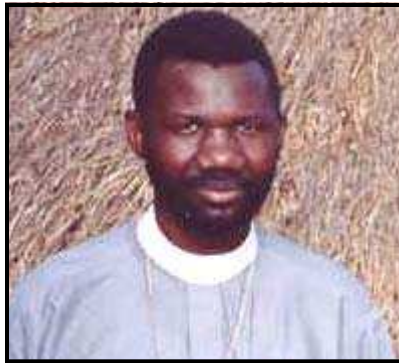
Bishop Andrew Elisa of Sudan Dies

One of the great Lutheran church leaders, Bishop Andrew Elisa of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Sudan, died on Dec. 31. His funeral was this past Friday. Bishop Elisa was in his mid 40's and died of a brain tumor. The following is from the Lutheran Heritage website:

The Holy Spirit worked mightily through Rev. Elisa to establish the ELCS. Fifteen years ago, the Lutheran Heritage Foundation sent Andrew Elisa five copies of Luther's Small Catechism and a Book of Concord. Excited by what he read, Andrew eagerly shared this good Lutheran doctrine with everyone he met.

Today, there are more than 80 Lutheran churches, five Lutheran elementary schools and two kindergartens located throughout Sudan, attended by more than 15,000 baptized Lutherans. More than a dozen men attend the seminary in Baguga, studying to become the faithful shepherds of these people.

"I've always been led by faith, full of optimism," said Rev. Elisa in a 2005 interview, as he reflected on the incredible growth of the ELCS. "If I think of something, I just want to do it, and I do it. I don't doubt. Some elements of pastoral practice were central in my thinking: 1. How do I shepherd the flock of God? 2. How do I reconcile the people of God? 3. How do I evan-



gelize the people of God? 4. How do I show love to these people? I'd also conceived the idea that our success would be based only on our commitment to the Word of God. It's God's doing."

"In my eyes Andrew is a hero of the faith and bold confessor of Christ," said Rev.

Richard Nuffer, a friend of the Elisa family and a member of the LHF Board of Directors. "He was a Lutheran pioneer in Sudan. I am glad God put LHF and Andrew together. Thanks be to God! Andrew now knows the true peace that passes all understanding."

"I met Rev. Elisa four years ago, when he stayed in my home and preached at my congregation in Elgin, Illinois," remembered Rev.

James Fandrey, LHF executive director. "Everyone was impressed with his commitment to bringing the Gospel of peace to the people of Sudan and his insistence on a proclamation that is consistent with both the Bible and the Lutheran Confessions."

Per Pastor Schumacher: Please pray for the Lutheran Church in Sudan. Bishop Elisa was blessed by God to be a very faithful leader for the Lutheran church there. Please consider giving a love offering to show your support for the spread of the Gospel in this country that is heavily Muslim. Also there have been considerable expenses with Bishop Elisa's hospitalization. Checks should be made out to Bethany and designated for Sudan.
