Worship At Bethany

Does Bethany offer contemporary worship? Does Bethany have traditional services? Worship at Bethany is both - and neither. Like many parishes, Bethany seeks to unite God's family in worship that rises above stylistic preferences.

Christian worship begins with the crucified Christ, who comes to us in Word and Sacrament. He brings to the people of God forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. We in turn extol these gifts with joyful thanksgiving and praise, proclaiming the story of God's love through His Word. This celebration is done in concert with the Church throughout the world, and finds its expression in the liturgy. Lutheran worship is therefore traditional in that it is part of the timeless culture of the Church, and contemporary in that it communicates the Gospel in ways that are appropriate to a given place and time. Since worship is the vocation of all baptized Christians, Lutheran liturgy calls for all individuals to do their parts, that faith may be increased among all who worship, and that Christ may be most strongly confessed before the world.

Providing worship that achieves these noble ends is the responsibility of any Christian congregation. Continuing in the tradition of the evangelical Lutheran communion, the Divine Service at Bethany seeks therefore to involve all who gather in the name of the Lord in the proclaiming, confessing, singing, and praying of God's Word.

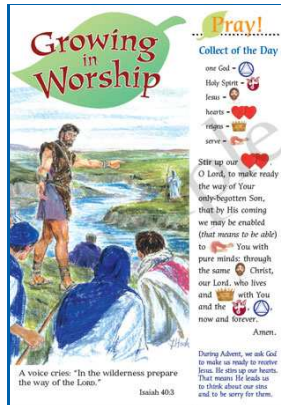
At the 11:15 a.m. service today, we celebrate the Rite of Welcome. You might ask, “What is the Rite of Welcome?” It is a rite to welcome those desiring to be catechumens at Bethany. These are adults who are new to the Lutheran faith. They have been worshipping with us and have been receiving instruction about the faith and are now ready to become members at Bethany. We welcome them as Catechumens today. From this point forward the Catechumens will have a sponsor as they receive further instruction leading to their confirmation at the Vigil of Easter. We have a formal Rite for the entire congregation to welcome these individuals as catechumens and to welcome them into the Bethany family and we rejoice in this. At the 11:15 a.m. service this morning we will gift our Catechumens with the books of the church, a Bible, Catechism, and Hymnal. Please welcome Joy, Stacey, and Mason into our midst. They are our family. Mark your calendar to be at the Easter Vigil to see them join our family at Bethany.

The Rite of Welcome is a part of the whole process of bringing adults into the Body of Christ through a process called the Catechumenate. We don’t want to just instruct adults about the faith; we want to incorporate them into the Body of Christ at Bethany so they truly understand by the end of the process that they are full members of the Body of Christ here at Bethany.

New Childrens' Bulletin Supplement Starting in March

Starting next month, Bethany will be providing a new resource to help children and families get the most out of the Divine Service each week. This full-color resource will provide help and activities for children aged 5-10 and includes fun and engaging family devotional ideas for children.

Colorful, eye-catching and interactive, this four-page weekly worship folder highlights the theme and message of the day and presents the time of the Church Year and special festivals. *Growing in Worship* engages children in the worship service—actually doing what others are doing, looking at the chancel, watching how things are done, listening for different words.
