Plan to Attend Voters Assembly Meeting This Tuesday, March 10

Our next quarterly Voters Assembly Meeting is set for Tuesday, March 10 at 7 p.m. The agenda for the meeting is available at the Welcome Center this weekend. Our quorum number now stands at 36. All confirmed members, age 14 and over, are encouraged to become members of the Voters Assembly which is the highest deliberative body in the congregation. Becoming a voter allows you to weigh in on important matters in the congregation and also makes you eligible to serve on one of our four boards or on a committee. Remember, you must state your intent to become a voter at one meeting and attend a second meeting within a year to become a voter. Once you become a member of the Voters Assembly, you must attend at least one meeting in a twelve month period to retain your eligibility.

Thinking of Serving on a Bethany Board or Committee?

If you are ready to get more involved in the many service and leadership opportunities at Bethany Lutheran Church and School, please come to the next Voters Assembly Meeting on March 10. Because members must attend one meeting to state their intent to become a voter and attend a second meeting to actually become a voting member, the sooner you attend a meeting, the sooner you can get more involved!

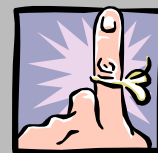

Sunday School

What we're learning in Sunday School this morning, March 8. As we enter the season of Lent, the Sunday School students study the account of "Jesus Calms a Storm." Just as Jesus calmed the storm with His Word for the frightened disciples, so He calms and ends the storm of sin and death by taking our sin upon Himself and dying in our place so we may live eternally. You may consider discussing with your family what Jesus did to calm the storm and how Jesus calms the storms in our lives.

Worship At Bethany

Does Bethany offer contemporary worship? Does Bethany have traditional services? Worship at Bethany is both - and neither. Like many parishes, Bethany seeks to unite God's family in worship that rises above stylistic preferences.

Christian worship begins with the crucified Christ, who comes to us in Word and Sacrament. He brings to the people of God forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. We in turn extol these gifts with joyful thanksgiving and praise, proclaiming the story of God's love through His Word. This celebration is done in concert with the Church throughout the world, and finds its expression in the liturgy. Lutheran worship is therefore traditional in that it is part of the timeless culture of the Church, and contemporary in that it communicates the Gospel in ways that are appropriate to a given place and time. Since worship is the vocation of all baptized Christians, Lutheran liturgy calls for all individuals to do their parts, that faith may be increased among all who worship, and that Christ may be most strongly confessed before the world.

Providing worship that achieves these noble ends is the responsibility of any Christian congregation. Continuing in the tradition of the evangelical Lutheran communion, the Divine Service at Bethany seeks therefore to involve all who gather in the name of the Lord in the proclaiming, confessing, singing, and praying of God's Word.

News From LWML

At the October Convention of the NID LWML, mission grants were chosen to fulfill the goal of spreading the Gospel. Receiving the most votes from the delegates was the grant for \$12,000 to the Concordia Seminary Food Bank at St. Louis. More than 50% of the students are married and many have children. Some of the 100 students on vicarage are serving near St. Louis and the deaconess studies program equips women of all ages for mercy ministry. Many of these students utilize the food bank for a majority of their monthly groceries. It would be far more challenging to prepare for future service in God’s mission field if the food bank did not exist.
