Palm Sunday and Easter Worship

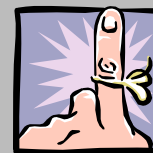

Sunday School

What we're learning in Sunday School this morning, March 22.

Students in Sunday School today explore the story "Jesus Clears the Temple." Jesus' cleansing of the temple carries a twofold message for the Jews and for us; first, that the true Lord of the temple was here in the flesh and second and more important, that Jesus is the true temple, who houses and perfects us, raising our bodies to be like His. Parents, you may wish to discuss why Jesus cleared the temple and how Jesus is our temple.

Worship At Bethany

Does Bethany offer contemporary worship? Does Bethany have traditional services? Worship at Bethany is both - and neither. Like many parishes, Bethany seeks to unite God's family in worship that rises above stylistic preferences.

Christian worship begins with the crucified Christ, who comes to us in Word and Sacrament. He brings to the people of God forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. We in turn extol these gifts with joyful thanksgiving and praise, proclaiming the story of God's love through His Word. This celebration is done in concert with the Church throughout the world, and finds its expression in the liturgy. Lutheran worship is therefore traditional in that it is part of the timeless culture of the Church, and contemporary in that it communicates the Gospel in ways that are appropriate to a given place and time. Since worship is the vocation of all baptized Christians, Lutheran liturgy calls for all individuals to do their parts, that faith may be increased among all who worship, and that Christ may be most strongly confessed before the world.

Providing worship that achieves these noble ends is the responsibility of any Christian congregation. Continuing in the tradition of the evangelical Lutheran communion, the Divine Service at Bethany seeks therefore to involve all who gather in the name of the Lord in the proclaiming, confessing, singing, and praying of God's Word.

Now that the weather is warming up and if you drive past the church and school early in the morning, you may see our track team sprinting and practicing their track skills.

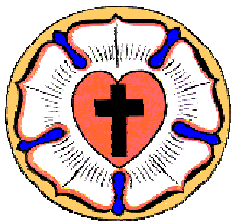

Killing of Human Embryos Now Funded by Federal Taxes

“Care Net President Melinda Delahoyde issued the following statement in response to President Obama’s decision to overturn current policy limiting federal funding of embryonic stem cell research:

“As Americans, with so much at our fingertips, we must do everything we can to find cures to diseases that take our loved ones from us so soon. No stone should be left unturned. Creative and passionate researchers, working within ethical guidelines, have done just this and been extremely successful. Through adult stem cell research, there have been incredible breakthroughs in treatments to a wide variety of diseases. We must continue to fund such successful research.

“But we also can agree that there are ethical limits that we must not cross. President Obama’s decision to lift the ban on federal funding for embryo stem cell research is misguided compassion and frankly, bad medicine. Not only is it unethical to create and destroy human beings for scientific research, but it’s unsuccessful -- not one disease has been cured through these methods. It should be known that the President’s decision not only allows for taxpayer funding of embryo research, it also opens the door for human cloning and destruction.

“At Care Net pregnancy centers, we seek to do all we can to protect human life by supporting women facing crisis pregnancies. Likewise, as a nation, we must do all we can to protect all life no matter how small, how deformed, or how old. We urge the President to reverse this decision and Congress to do all they can to oppose it.”

This decision by the new administration continues a string of measures that are against the sanctity of life. The administration has already lifted the ban to pay for abortions in foreign countries as well as removing rules designed to protect medical personnel from discrimination when they do not want to participate in abortions.
